#### **2. New Academic Programmes Initiated (UG AND PG):**

No new academic programmes were initiated in the session 2009-2010, however a 3-day English language training workshop training was organised in the college for English language skills enhancement for teachers and students in the newly inducted Digital Language Lab of the College. Mr. Aji Thomas from Wordsworth Limited, Hyderabad conducted this workshop through computer based method.

The trainer acquainted the trainees how and when to use the trainer manual, the ILT software, the CBT software and the flash cards. The training was followed by 'mock-training sessions' of training of English language using the Wordsworth software followed by all the trainees and a general feedback by the trainer.

#### **2. Innovations in Curricular Design and Transaction**

- Innovations in Curricular Design and Transaction focus on clear improvements in achievement and personal development of the students.
- A range of approaches are often explored such as enquiry learning, practical learning, constructive learning etc.
- An attempt is made to minimise the anxiety level amongst the students by regular revisions, class tests, snap tests, transparency in internal assessment and providing a platform to the all the students to nurture their talent.

- A link is maintained between the institution and the community through various social service and outreach programmes.
- Teachers make teaching plans on daily basis. This helps them to be more systematic in their work.
- The teachers regularly make use of technology in classroom transaction.
- Lectures by the experts are also organised to provide exposure to the students.
- The overall aim remains to develop a modern, world-class curriculum that will inspire and challenge all student teachers and prepare them for the future.

#### **4. Inter-disciplinary programmes**

The main inter-disciplinary programmes conducted during this year were:

##### **“Quality Teacher Education in Global Era”- An Extension Lecture**

An Extension Lecture was delivered by Dr. M.R.Chillana, (Retd.) Professor of Education, NCERT, on “Quality Teacher Education in Global Era” on 13<sup>th</sup> January. He emphasized the multi-dimensional growth of the teachers as well as the learners and the essence of life which according to him lies in education. He stressed that life and philosophy of life are two things which would decide one’s course of action.

##### **Extension Lecture on Programmed Learning**

The College organized an Extension Lecture on ‘Programmed Learning. Dr. Sodhi, Retd. Senior Reader of Punjab University, delivered a lecture emphasizing the significance of Programmed Learning in present times. Through presentations, he elaborated the important elements and types of programmed learning. He suggested the different set frames in the teaching methodology. The lecture was followed by an interactive session in which the sequence of frames was discussed.

#### **5. Examination Reforms Implemented**

The college is affiliated to Panjab University Chandigarh. Hence, the norms set by Panjab University in conducting Examinations in B.Ed., M.Ed. and Post Graduate Diploma in Guidance and Counselling are strictly followed. The college conducts

internal house tests twice a year as per the university rules. The college also conducts class tests every month to make the students face the annual examinations with confidence. The question papers set for the house tests are on the pattern of the University examination. Internal assessment is also given on the basis of marks in these tests as per university rules.

The following examination reforms were implemented:

1. Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation was done throughout the year assessing the students' performance in scholastic and co-scholastic areas.
2. OMR answer sheets were introduced this year as per the pattern of university examinations.
3. The mistakes were brought to the notice of the students, which enabled them to identify and rectify those mistakes in the university examinations.
4. Parents were informed about the progress of their wards by sending letters especially about those students who do not perform well in the examinations.
5. Remedial classes were conducted for the students who did not fare well in the house tests.
6. The whole examination process is done under the guidance of the examination committee.

Every year a good number of students qualify UGC-NET examination after completing their M.Ed for which guidance is provided by the college.

## **7. Initiatives towards Faculty Development Programme**

The various activities organised by the college for the professional development of the faculty in this year were:

### **Lecture on Communication Skills**

A Lecture on Communication Skills was held at the College on 21<sup>st</sup> August, 2009. The Key Speaker was Mrs. Charanjit Kaur, Lecturer in Home Science. She highlighted the importance of good communication skills necessary for a teacher. She emphasized that effective communication involves more than merely putting words together. She stressed on six main elements of communication-1)source of communication 2)communication material 3)communication media 4) receiver 5) environmental conditions and situations 6)facilitators or barriers. In the end, she suggested activities for teachers to develop communication skills like practicing in front of mirror, developing good reading habits and need for building a relationship with audience while communicating.

### **Extension Lecture on Moralistic Values**

On 23<sup>rd</sup> November, 2009, A discourse on Value Education by Mr. K.M. Tripathi a spiritual counselor and philosopher of ISKCON – International Society for Krishna Consciousness was held at the college premises. He related the Maxim of Aristotle and in his enlightening address to the prospective teachers he stated that one should strive for a sound mind through righteous means such as self discipline, self control and self realization.

He emphasized on the four gurus: The Shiksha Guru-Teachers; Janam Guru -Parents; Granth Guru - Religion. Chaitya Guru -Parmatma. He cited a great example from history, when Britishers had conquered India and took over all the aspects but failed

to acquire the one and only aspect, the enriching Vedic Culture which forms the strong foundation of the Indian Culture. CULTURE: It is the life line of what makes an Indian – A Man of Substance.

Dr. Jyoti Khanna, principal also spoke on the importance of inculcating the aforesaid values; She said that the prospective teachers should not only possess them but also impart the same to coming generations. Towards the end of her inspirational speech, she proposed to the students to be more disciplined, dutiful and responsible citizens of India.

Professor Shelly Walia, Director, Academic Staff College, Panjab University, Chandigarh was the Guest of Honour for the occasion. The Technical Session was presided over by Dr. Amit Kauts. A workshop was conducted after the seminar in which the delegates discussed various quality enhancing measures such as skill based training, flexible curriculum, comprehensive evaluation system, stress management programs etc. which will help in imparting quality education.

### **Workshop on 'Stress Management'**

A Workshop on 'Stress Management' was organized in the college campus in which various techniques to handle stress in or day to day life were discussed. Students also posed their problem and the methods to resolve these problems were also discussed by the experts in the workshop. The basic necessity to accept, recognize and manage stress was emphasized upon.

### **9. New Collaborative Research Programme**

#### **Lecture on Research Methodology**

The College organized a series of Lectures on Research Methodology which commenced from 16<sup>th</sup> July and continued till 29<sup>th</sup> of July, 2009. The key speakers were Prof. (Dr.) N.S.Mavi, from Department of Education, Kurukshetra University, Dr. Nain Singh, Reader, Department of Education, Himachal Pradesh University,

Shimla and Sh.Raminder Singh, Department of Education, Punjabi University, Regional Center, Bathinda.

Dr. Nain Singh highlighted the importance of objectives of his study and a research problem in an efficient manner. Dr.Raminder singh, emphasized on the objectives that they should be framed in such a way that the wordings should clearly, completely and specifically communicates the purpose of study. The Lecture was attended by all the M.Ed. students as well as the faculty members.

## **10. Details of Research undertaken**

### **Post Graduate Research Studies**

The institute promotes and initiates research pertaining to education and trends. The range of areas include the issues related to teaching effectiveness in relation to job satisfaction, conflict management styles among under-graduate students in relation to their perception of parenting styles, adjustment patterns of senior secondary school students in relation to their problem solving ability, mental health of adolescents in relation to their attitude towards modernization etc.
